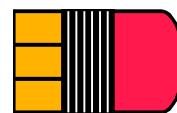

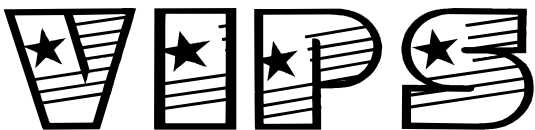
The Memory Book is well under way now! Sure you send in your baby/toddler picture and Kindergarten picture by **Oct. 22<sup>nd</sup>**.
